

Luxemburg



The Grand Duchy of Luxembourg is a small country surrounded by Belgium, France and Germany, and its history has been inextricably linked with that of its larger neighbors. It is largely made up of rolling hills and forests.

Luxembourg has been under the control of many states and ruling houses in its long history, but it has been a separate, if not always autonomous, political unit since the 10th century. Today, Luxembourg is a hereditary Grand Duchy with a unicameral parliamentary system. Luxembourgish, the national language, is akin to German. German is the first foreign language for most Luxembourgers and is used in the media. French is the administrative language.

The economic structure of Luxembourg is based mainly in banking, insurance, and the steel industry. Agriculture and wine production are also important.

Many of Luxembourg's speciality dishes are of the type one would expect in a forested country. They include jugged hare and Ardennes ham. Trout and pike, fresh from the country's rivers, also feature regularly on menus here.

Luxembourg shares the Moselle valley with Germany and the local white wines are well known and popular. Like other northern European countries, Luxembourg also produces popular brands of beer.

Automotive expertise in Luxembourg

Since 1998, the automotive expert profession is subsidiary to the job of mechanic and is under the Guild chamber rules.

One of the above conditions is necessary to become automotive expert:

- Hold a diploma attesting a good command of loss adjusting delivered by Luxembourg authorities or equivalent foreign authorities and accredited in Luxembourg.
- Hold a diploma attesting a good command in automotive loss adjusting delivered by Luxembourg authorities or competent foreign authorities, accredited in Luxembourg, and fulfils the conditions necessary to settle an affiliated automotive loss adjusting workshop, after approval of Luxembourg competent authorities.
- Holder of the engineer / industrial engineer / technician engineer diploma OR an automotive experts school diploma and fulfill the conditions to settle an accessory automotive expert workshop, after approval of Luxembourg competent authorities.
